COVID-19 – How RCY has Adapted

- Quick transition in mid-March to staff working from home
- Advocates adapted to all communication by phone, email, etc.
- Daily communiques, frequent leadership and staff check-ins
- Formed RCY COVID-19 Response Team, redeploying 3.25 FTEs to these duties
- RCY social media campaign initiated with community partners, aimed at children and youth during pandemic #covidandkidsbc





COVID-19 – How RCY has Adapted cont.'

- COVID Response Team:
 - Reviews, analyzes and summarizes COVID-related reports of critical injuries and deaths, COVID-related advocacy cases, reports from service providers and stakeholders and other information sources to identify issues and themes
 - Proactively obtains information on policy and practice changes to ensure advocates are able to fulfill their duties with young people, family members and caregivers who are confused, worried and stressed



COVID-19 – How RCY has Adapted cont.'

- RCY brings forward these issues and themes to leadership in MCFD and other ministries and public bodies through regular briefings, meetings, phone calls
- This is how we're relaying info to be most helpful during pandemic
- Not releasing RCY reports with recommendations at this time
- Don't want to distract government from its most important work, but still critical to provide independent feedback and information we have gathered to help inform decisions.



What We're Seeing/Hearing

- 91 COVID-related Advocacy cases opened to date, dealing with a wide range of issues
- COVID-19 has been mentioned in 122 critical injury and 2 death reports received since March 1, including:
 - Social distancing was a concern in 75 cases (60%).
 - Access to services or important people was a concern in 33 cases (27%).
 - COVID-19 exposure was a concern in 27 cases (22%).
 - Placement was affected by COVID-19 in 12 cases (10%)
 - COVID-19 impacted court availability in 4 cases
- Many examples of responsive, creative practice



COVID-Related Areas of Concern

- Children and youth with special needs, their families and caregivers
- Youth aging out of care, placements and supports
- Lack of access to technology, leaving youth feeling cut off
- Children and youth being exposed to violence, victimized.



COVID-Related Areas of Concern, cont.'

- Homeless youth and youth at risk of homelessness
- Mental health of children and youth and lack of access to services
- Substance use and lack of access to services
- Well-being of First Nations, Métis, Inuit and urban Indigenous children and youth, including access to cultural supports



COVID-Related Areas of Concern, cont.'

- Safety in foster and residential resource placements
- Suspension of visits between children and youth in care and their family members
- Child protection responses, removals and custody disputes
- Pandemic's impact on day-to-day MCFD services.
